Kishan has been associated with Project Sanlaap for the past 11 years and has actively worked on various campaigns for child rights awareness. He received education support from Sanlaap and worked with the team on prevention of child marriage and child labor.

Coming from a humble background, the journey hasn't been easy for Kishan. After losing his parents at a tender age, Kishan was raised by his grandmother. Growing up, he faced financial constraints often making education a distant dream. Therefore, he attributes his success to Sanlaap for helping him study and navigate his life decisions.

Sanlaap has motivated Kishan to work with underprivileged children just as he was supported in his youth. His goal is to help children thrive in their lives and fulfill their dreams. Kishan's journey is indeed a story of hope for thousands who dream of their right to education, as nothing empowers more than education.

Under the theme "YOU put the 'Y' in CRY", the Galas celebrated all of CRY America's donors, volunteers, sponsors and media supporters who play an integral role in our mission of creating lasting change for children in need. Despite the need to travel far distances to practice badminton, Nita's love for the sport helped her excel to new heights. She also secured second position in the National Sports for Change competition conducted by the HCL Foundation. Nita was determined to continue improving her game and achieve success.

# Salman's journey from struggle to hope - Project Sikshasandhan

\*Salman, a 10 year old boy, faced financial struggles as his family worked as daily laborers. The situation became worse, when his mother passed away and he had to drop out of school to care for his younger siblings. To contribute to the family's income, Salman started weaving leaf plates and selling them in the local market.



Project Sikshasandhan learnt about his situation during a house visit and discussed

his case in the children's collective. The project team counseled his father on the importance of education and ill effects of child labor. They also connected the family to the ICDS center, where childcare was arranged for his sisters, allowing Salman to return to his studies.

He is now studying in Grade 6 at a residential school and aspires to become a police officer. Salman's journey showcases that with the right support, children can pave the way for a brighter future.

# CRY America Joins IPA for First-Ever India Giving Day



# Nonprofits to Cooperate on Thursday, March 2 to Create a Brighter Future for India's Marginalized Communities

CRY, Child Rights and You America (CRY America) is excited to announce the launch of India Giving Day (IGD) under the leadership of the India Philanthropy Alliance (IPA).

IPA, a coalition of 16 of the leading India-focused non-profits in the USA, is organizing the first-ever India Giving Day on Thursday, March 2, 2023, with early giving starting on February 14. This campaign will highlight the contributions made by Americans, notably the Indian American diaspora, to critical causes in India.

CRY America is a 501c3 non-profit driven by its vision of a just world in which all children have equal opportunities to develop to their full potential. With the support of 25,000 donors and 2,000 volunteers, CRY America has impacted the lives of 786,000 children living across 5,000 villages and slums. Supported Projects ensure access to education and healthcare for underprivileged children, as well as

protection from child labor, early marriage, and trafficking.

"We are thrilled to be part of the path-breaking India Philanthropy Alliance and the newly initiated India Giving Day," said CRY America CEO Shefali Sunderlal. "This collaboration is a great opportunity to significantly increase fundraising in the USA directed towards a variety of critical human rights and



children's rights issues in India."

The profiles of the 22 participating non-profits can be found on the India Giving Day website. All organizations will undertake a series of activities to promote India Giving Day such as youth outreach, donor and volunteer outreach, social media promotions, and organizing of local events.

IPA has carefully designed and executed this initiative, including the development of a secure website. India Giving Day provides a credible one-stop platform to donate, fundraise, and secure sponsorships for the causes you care about.

# Breaking Barriers Through Education - Project PORD

15 year-old \*Prerna is from Madanapalle, Andhra Pradesh, where CRY America-supported project People's Organization for Rural Development (PORD) has been making fantastic progress in bettering the lives of children under the leadership of Lalithamma, especially girls.

Prerna's mother is a single parent and the sole bread earner in the family. Due to financial difficulties she was on the verge of



discontinuing her daughter's education as she worried about her safety and wanted to get Prerna married.

After the PORD team came to know about Prerna's heightened risk of early marriage, they began counseling both mother and daughter. To ensure that Prerna continued to attend school, the team visited her home regularly and invited her to attend career guidance sessions convened by PORD for Grade 9 and 10 students. Information about courses and colleges, and career-mapping activities were shared.

Prerna shared her own dream of attending IIIT and launching a career in technology. PORD helped her after school with study methods and provided encouragement. Prerna helped other children with information she learnt from the Career Guidance Sessions.

Prerna scored 555 marks out of 600 in her Grade 10 board exams, taking first place not just in her school, but in the entire block! As a newly admitted IIIT student, Prerna is well on her way to becoming a software engineer – and she has already become a role model for other girls in her village.

"I am extremely confident about myself and feel happy now," Prerna told us. "Had the PORD team not given guidance on career development, I wouldn't have worked so hard to get good scores, nor would I have applied for this course. My first-place standing at school and block level is owed to the career guidance and life skills I received from PORD."
