Formalities were completed for her admission to a nursing course at Allied Hospital in Bilaspur. Today, she works there as a

nurse while finishing her final year of college.

Problem: Lack of access to education in Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh leads to children dropping out of school and becoming child laborers.

Solution: Enrolling children in preschool, linking them to scholarship programs, forming Children's Collectives & strengthening School Management Committees

Project Impact

- 1,724 children (ages 6-18) enrolled in school.
- 628 Children's Collective members attended meetings regularly.
- 297 children enrolled in Anganwadi Centers for preschool education.
- 105 dropout children re-enrolled in schools.
- 307 adolescent girls received life skills training.

2-year-old Abdul was losing weight 7 months after birth & was identified as Moderately Acute Malnourished (MAM). Project GVM ensured his complete vaccination & counseled his family on nutritious eating habits. However, due to loss of appetite, his condition worsened & the Growth Monitoring Committee (GMC) referred him to the Nutritional Rehabilitation Center (NRC) as he was diagnosed with Severe Acute

Malnutrition (SAM). GVM team along with the Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (ANM), Anganwadi Workers (AWW), Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHA) workers, and the Primary Health Center (PHC) doctor, counseled Abdul's hesitant parents to admit him to the NRC. With regular checkups, nutritious food, medicine, and guidance from frontline workers, Abdul's condition improved. He now weighs 10 kg and leads a healthier life with nutritious food habits.

The Problem: Low health awareness, poor nutrition, and flood-prone schools impact children's health and school retention.

The Solution: Ensuring healthcare access, tackling malnutrition, and improving school enrollment and retention.

Project Impact

- 342 women linked to maternity programs
- 378 institutional deliveries ensured
- 948 children received 100% immunization
- 260 children enrolled in schools
- 2,077 children retained in schools.

How Nisha Reclaimed Her Right To Learn Project SSRF



Nisha, a bright girl from Uttar Pradesh, was forced to drop out after Grade 11 due to her mother's limited income. Since Nisha's father was in prison, they faced social stigma & financial challenges. Project SSRF intervened through home visits & counseled her family to re-enroll Nisha and her two sisters in school. To support their transition back to school, Nisha was enrolled in CRY's Digital Learning Center,

while her two sisters joined the Child Activity Center. She attended career counseling sessions to explore higher education opportunities. She is currently studying in Grade 12 & is planning to pursue higher education in the science stream. After completing her B.Sc. in Biology, she wants to start preparing for the Army entrance examination, as she aspires to join the Army.

The Problem: Distant schools in Varanasi & Bhadohi cause high dropouts resulting to child labor, and early marriage.

The Solution: Rescuing child laborers, preventing child marriage and strengthening child protection system with relevant stakeholders.

Project Impact

- 4,525 children aged 15-18 years retained in schools
- 523 children enrolled in remedial education
- 274 potential child marriages prevented
- 500 community members sensitized on child protection issues
- 675 adolescents participated in Life Skills Sessions

Child marriage is a major barrier in a girl's life. To address this, CRY's project KMAGVS in Latur, Maharashtra, introduced 'Balvani', a community radio where girls could speak freely. An IVRS number was also shared with them where children could report issues, and get help within 48 hours. When Akansha* faced the threat of child marriage after Grade 10, she used the IVRS to raise her voice. The project team intervened,

counseled her parents, and helped stop the marriage. Akansha stayed in school, topped her Grade 10 exams, and began speaking out on the radio against gender discrimination. She now inspires others in her community to pursue education and stand up for their rights.

The Problem: Seasonal migration, child marriage, and distant schools in Latur disrupt children's education.

The Solution: The project ensures school enrollment, financial stability through government program linkages, and community awareness on education and child rights.

Project Impact

- 1,745 children aged 6-14 retained in schools
- 179 potential child marriages prevented
- 2,031 children aged 6-18 attending remedial support classes
- 10 children removed from child labor
- 421 families connected to financial security programs
